The first recorded competition between disabled athletes was in 1948 in Stoke Mandeville, England.



1960 was the first time the Olympics and Paralympics were held together in Rome, Italy.



Athletes with a learning disability were first included in the Paralympics in 1996.



The Paralympics in Rio start on the 7th September 2016.



In the 2016 Rio Paralympics athletes with a learning disability can compete in Athletics, Swimming and Table Tennis.



There are 7 athletes from Great Britain (GB) with a learning disability competing this year in Rio.



5 GB athletes with a Learning Disability are competing in the swimming events.



2 GB athletes with a Learning Disability are competing in the athletics.

Paralympic Facts



There are 4 values for the Paralympics. These are Courage, Determination, Inspiration and Equality.



The mascot for the Rio 2016 Paralympics is called Tom. He is made from all the plants in the Brazilian forests.



The word Paralympic is from a Greek word meaning 'beside' and refers to a competition held in parallel with the Olympic Games.

Jessica-Jane Applegate



Jessica-Jane Applegate is a Mencap Ambassador and is completing at the Rio Paralympics in the Swimming.

Jessica-Jane won gold at London 2012 in the 200m Freestyle. Rio 2016 is her second Paralympics.

Things you will need


- A3 paper
