


How do energy bills work?



Energy bills are based on how much electricity or gas you use at home.



Energy is charged by the unit.



A **unit** is like a piece or block of energy.



The more units of energy you use, the more you pay.



You might also pay a **standing charge**.





A **standing charge** is a price you pay every day, even if you do not use any energy that day.



The **standing charge** pays for the pipes, wires and people that bring energy to your home.



Your energy supplier looks at 3 things to work out your bill:



 Standing charge: how many days does the bill cover?



• Electricity use: how many units of electric have you used?



 Gas use: how many units of gas have you used?



The energy supplier adds the cost of the 3 things together to work out your bill.
