## TALKING POINTS

- Do you know what a Myth Buster does? (A Myth Buster is someone who shows you that something is not true)
- What kinds of jobs do the Myth Busters have? (pop star, artist, athletes, activists, business owners, actors, a model, a dancer, a football coach, and many more!)
- Did any of their jobs or activities surprise you? (people with a learning disability can do all kinds of things, most people with a learning disability can and want to work, as long as they are given the right support)
- Do you think you can tell when someone has a learning disability just by looking at them? (Jessica Jane Applegate has an MBE and is a Paralympic swimmer. She wants to bust this Myth! People who have a learning disability don't all look the same; just because I may not look like I have a disability, it doesn't mean it's not there! I've been told so many times in the past that I don't look 'disabled' enough for things like sponsorship deals.)
- Can you communicate with a person with a learning disability? (Activist Brendan Chivisa who is featured in the video says: You can't communicate with a person with a learning disability; not true, I have a lot to say about a lot of things!)
- Do the Mythbusters make you want to raise money for Mencap? Why?
- What fundraising activities would you like to do this year?
- How much money should we try to raise? (Our schools support can help more people with a learning disability to shine. Just like the Myth Busters)
